# Future Leaders Programme

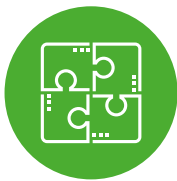


Future Stroke Leaders is an initiative of the WSO to develop the technical and research skills of the next generation of stroke professionals. It is a tailored 2-year programme to equip a global cohort of early career clinicians and researchers with in-depth understanding of the key challenges in relation to stroke and how these challenges can be addressed within diverse stroke care systems.

## What is Future Stroke Leaders Programme

The programme brings together participants to engage with the latest research, stroke care quality improvement tools, and resources that are designed to support effective delivery of stroke care services and advocacy for stroke care investment.

Graduates from the program are expected to go on to take leadership roles in national, regional, and global stroke organizations' research networks using the knowledge, skills and networks they have forged, to drive improvements for stroke patients around the world.

Participants will work in diverse groups to develop actionable projects, a selection of which will receive budgetary support.

The curriculum spans the stroke care continuum from prevention, acute treatment, post-stroke care through to rehabilitation. It supports the development of key skills including research and peer review, writing for publication, care quality improvement tools, multidisciplinary collaboration, project design, management, and stroke advocacy.

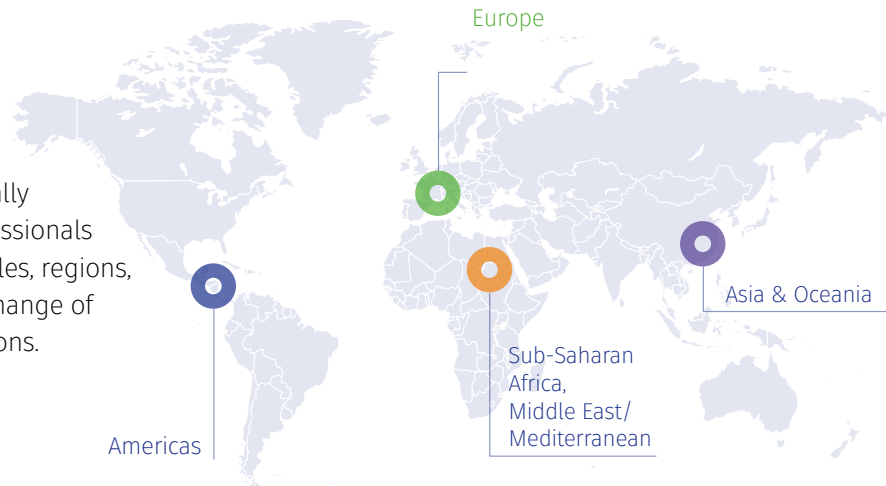
# PROGRAMME REQUIREMENTS
